

LOCATION

Manor Place Depot will comprise 270 new homes and a restored, Grade II listed former bathing complex for commercial uses, surrounded by newly created and high-quality public realm. In addition to nine railway arches, the Bath House has planning consent for further B1 commercial space up to 24,000 sq ft. The scheme is within metres of Walworth Road and a 9 minute walk from stations at both Elephant and Castle (Northern, Bakerloo and National Rail) and Kennington (Northern Bank and Charing Cross branches).

ACCOMMODATION

The arches retail and leisure space within Manor Place Depot comprises 17 railway arches fronting a newly created, pedestrianised walkway which connects Manor Place and Penrose Street. The scheme offers an outstanding opportunity to become part of a new community in the heart of SE17. The arches are suitable for a variety of uses and benefit from A1, A2, A3, D1 and D2 planning uses. Each arch is partially fitted to include screeded floors, lined walls, first fix plumbing and electrics and glazed shop fronts.

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THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

Walworth Road is an authentic London high street retaining a unique character formed over decades by a seriously diverse range of retailers. Connecting Camberwell with Elephant and Castle, the surrounding area is the subject of major change, and with the nearby £3bn regeneration of Elephant and Castle and the ongoing redevelopment of the Aylesbury Estate, the local resident population is set to increase in size significantly and become even more diverse.

One of London's oldest and largest street markets at East Street adds to the vibrancy of the area and trades Tuesday to Sunday every week. Amongst these you can find a wide array of national operators including Boots, Superdrug, Marks & Spencer, Argos, Morrisons, Post Office, Barclays and Sports Direct.






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
